SUBJECT: **Action Item # 4-** Consider Approving the revision of Resolution 19-20-08 authorizing the Housing Authority to act as the Housing Development Sponsor for Mariposa County No Place Like Home (NPLH) Application St. Andrews Chalet.

RESOLUTION NO: 20-21-04

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the date revision to Resolution 19-20-08 authorizing the Housing Authority to act as the Housing Development Sponsor and to apply for Competitive NPLH funding in partnership with Mariposa County to increase the number of affordable housing units in Mariposa County. Under the NPLH regulations County applicants are permitted to partner with a Housing Development Sponsor when applying for NPLH funding. Mariposa County and the Housing Authority were informed that the funding application for St. Andrews Chalet was approved for funding. In order to complete the final Standard Agreements to receive the funding the previously approved Resolution 19-20-08 needs to have the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) date on the Resolution updated to the revised NOFA date of September 27, 2019. Additionally, the authorized funding amount in the 19-20-08 Resolution has been revised to allow for additional funding provided by the Housing and Community Development Department. The funding approved for the project is \$2,339,020.

Background

On July 1, 2016, Governor Brown signed landmark legislation enacting the No Place Like Home (NPLH) program to dedicate up to \$2 billion in bond proceeds to invest in the development of permanent supportive housing for persons who are in need of mental health services and are experiencing homelessness, chronic homelessness, or who are at risk of chronic homelessness. The bonds are repaid by funding from the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA).

Key features of the program include:

- Counties will be eligible applicants (either solely or with a housing development sponsor).
- Funding for permanent supportive housing must utilize low barrier tenant selection practices that prioritize vulnerable populations and offer flexible, voluntary, and individualized supportive services.



- Counties must commit to provide mental health services and help coordinate access to other community-based supportive services.

Purpose

To acquire, design, construct, rehabilitate, or preserve permanent supportive housing for persons who are experiencing homelessness, chronic homelessness or who are at risk of chronic homelessness, and who are in need of mental health services.

Population to be Served

Adults with serious mental illness, or children with severe emotional disorders and their families and persons who require or are at risk of requiring acute psychiatric inpatient care, residential treatment, or outpatient crisis intervention because of a mental disorder with symptoms of psychosis, suicidality or violence and who are homeless, chronically homeless, or at risk of chronic homelessness.

At risk of chronic homelessness includes persons who are at high risk of long-term or intermittent homelessness, including persons with mental illness exiting institutionalized settings with a history of homelessness prior to institutionalization, and transition age youth experiencing homelessness or with significant barriers to housing stability.

Assistance Type

Loans to counties*, or their housing development sponsors.

The State of California, Department of Housing and Community Development (“Department”) issued a Notice of Funding Availability, dated October 15, 2018 as amended on October 30, 2018 (“NOFA”) under the No Place Like Home Program (“NPLH” or “Program”) authorized by Government Code section 15463, Part 3.9 of Division 5 (commencing with Section 5849.1) of the Welfare and Institutions Code, and Welfare and Institutions Code section 5890.

The Housing Authority has been approached by the County of Mariposa to act as their Development Partner for their NPLH funding applications. The NPLH regulations require a Board Resolution authorizing the Housing Authority to act as the Housing Development Sponsor and to apply for the NPLH funding.

Housing Authority Commitments

The Housing Authority, as a Housing Development Sponsor, may need to expend funds on predevelopment costs such as appraisals, inspections, architectural and engineering designs, title reports, environmental reviews, etc. to meet the requirements for the NPLH application submittal(s). Some of these expenses may be reimbursed with NPLH funds if received. Any property funded by the NPLH program shall become the property of the Housing Authority.

SECTION 1. That the Housing Authority is hereby authorized and directed to borrow an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000 in NPLH Program funds, as detailed in the NOFA up to the amount authorized by Section 102 of the Guidelines and applicable state law (the "NPLH Loan").

SECTION 2. That in connection with the NPLH Loan, the Housing Authority is authorized and directed to enter into, execute, and deliver a State of California Standard Agreement, and any and all other documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate to carry into effect the full intent and purpose of the above resolution, in order to evidence the NPLH Loan, the Housing Authority's obligations related thereto, and the Department's security therefore; including, but not limited to, a promissory note, a deed of trust and security agreement, a regulatory agreement, a development agreement and certain other documents required by the Department as security for, evidence of or pertaining to the NPLH Loan, and all amendments thereto (collectively, the "NPLH Loan Documents").

SECTION 3. That Barbara Kauss, Executive Director and/or Jim Kruse Deputy Director are hereby authorized to execute the NPLH Loan Documents, and any amendments or modifications thereto, on behalf of the Housing Authority.
